
- A. Jesus as rabbi: teaches the kingdom of God

- D. No prerequisites to be a disciple


Jesus Calls Levi (Matthew): Two Sets of Two Vocations

 ¹³ He went out again beside the sea, and all the crowd was coming to him, and he was teaching them. ¹⁴ And as he passed by, he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him.

Levi as Tax Collector

- Jewish, the son of Alphaeus
- Bid for the position to Roman officials
- Kept any money above an agreed amount paid to Rome
- Customs official: taxed merchants and fishermen
- Operated from a booth on the Via Maris (Way of the Sea)

Jesus Banquets with "Outcasts" (Mark 2:15)

 ¹⁵ And as he reclined at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners were reclining with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him.

No Prerequisites: (Matthew 11:28-30)

²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

A Religious Tradition: Fasting

¹⁸ Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting. And people came and said to him, "Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?"

Fasting: The Day of Atonement (+)

²⁶ And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, ²⁷ "Now on the tenth day of this seventh month is the Day of Atonement. It shall be for you a time of holy convocation, and you shall fast, and present a food offering to the LORD. ²⁸ And you shall not do any work on that very day, for it is a Day of Atonement, to make atonement for you before the LORD your God. ²⁹ For whoever is not fasting on that very day shall be cut off from his people.

--Leviticus 23:26-29

Together with Christ: "Already" No Fasting

 ¹⁹ And Jesus said to them, "Can the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is with them? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast.

Together with Christ: "Not Yet" Fasting

• ²⁰ The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast in that day.

• Prophesy of Christ's death

Wisdom literature: paradox and context (Mark 2:21)

²¹ No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old garment. If he does, the patch tears away from it, the new from the old, and a worse tear is made.

Patch or Replace?

- Worn-out Old Traditions → Replace with new and better (e.g. "Legalism")
- Fad religious traditions → Avoid!
 ("New Age" philosophy)
- Valuable Old Traditions → Keep!
 (Worship, Communion)
- Worn-in Old Traditions → Wears well ☺
 (Bible Study, Prayer Life, Community Service)

Wisdom literature: paradox and context (Mark 2:22)

²² And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the wine will burst the skins—and the wine is destroyed, and so are the skins.
 But new wine is for fresh wineskins."

Uncontainable Spirit (2 Corinthians 5:17-19)

- ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. ¹⁸ All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.
- Levi, a tax collector, reconciled to God through Jesus Christ
