

Paul's Pep Talk (Romans 8:31-39)

Romans 8:31-34

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?
³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?

- ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies.
- ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.

Romans 8:35-39

³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?

³⁶ As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long;

we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.
³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers,

³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Paul Builds Confidence

- Key Verse:
- "In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us" (Romans 8:37)

"hypernikomen" (Greek): "super conquerors"

1. Against God, there is no real competition (Romans 8:31)

- ³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? (Romans 8:31)
- One Creator/One "Standard"
- Our real choice is not "God or the enemy," but "With-God or Not-with-God"
- ¹¹ And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his
 Son. ¹² Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not
 have life. (1 John 5:11-12).

2. God gave the best; He will also give the rest (Romans 8:32)

³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? (Romans 8:32)

• God Gave the Best:

 ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, (Philippians 4:9-10)

• God Gives the Rest:

 ³³ But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. (Matthew 6:33)

3. God has already decided the outcome (Romans 8:33)

- ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies (Romans 8:33)
- "Justified": our sin-ledger has been wiped clean
- ³⁰ And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified (Romans 8:30).
- **Justification:** "a sinner is justified (pardoned from the punishment and condemnation of sin) and brought into relationship with God by faith in God's grace alone" (*Pocket Dictionary of Theological Terms*)
- No "double jeopardy"

3. God has already decided the outcome (Romans 8:33)

• God's will is unalterable:

⁷ "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: 'The words of the holy one, the true one, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens' (Revelation 3:7)

4. God sets the rules, we don't (Romans 8:34)

 ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us (Romans 8:34)

• Only Jesus is qualified to judge, yet he intercedes for us instead:

 ¹⁴ Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things . . . ¹⁷ Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. (Hebrews 2:14,17)

5.God's assurance of our salvation (Romans 8:35-39)

- ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?
- ³⁶ As it is written,
- "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." (Psalm 44:22)
- ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.
- ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers,
- ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

5.God's assurance of our salvation (Romans 8:35-39)

²⁷ My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand (John 10:27-28)

6. Victory is ours only by God's love for us through Jesus Christ

- ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us (Romans 8:37)
- ¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16)
- ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing (John 15:4-5)

Live victoriously!

"I Can Do All Things Through Christ who Strengthens Me" (Philippians 4:13) ²⁴ Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. (1 Cor. 9:24)





Keep Your Eyes on the (Real) Prize

- ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7)
- ¹⁰ let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth . . . there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men and women by which we must be saved (Acts 4:10a, 12)
